


For the first 3 weeks of my internship, I worked on digitalizing architectural surveys that the employees had taken previously by hand. I had done so in the past in my Architectural Drawing Class 1 through 4. The difference between my internship experience of architectural surveys and my in-class ones were that, in-class, I had done the entire process, from hand drawings to digitalizing. During my internship, we worked as a team, hence I hadn't seen the space we were working on and had to only rely on the drawings in front of me. This worked in my favour because I had experienced what it would be like in the real world, you don't always get to do both drawings. At first, when doing these tasks, I was afraid of asking questions, fearing the answer should be clear as day, but I quickly learned that it was okay to ask if unsure, especially for measurements as they are extremely important to be accurate. Again, we're not in the original drawer's head.

Another skill learned in my Interior Design classes that I had to work on was space planning. I was given a deck, on the first week, and an office on the second week. For the deck, I had a lot of freedom in terms of spacial planning, the design was very simple to begin with, with small adjustments to cater the clients. Decks and outside areas is not a space I am familiar with nor have I ever touched that section. It was rather interesting because they really helped me with understanding the entire project as a whole and even showed me the end result to ensure I was part of the team.



For the office, there were a lot more requirements I had to fulfill, therefore I gave 2 options to insure all requirements were met. The office is a project that I've done before in my second semester at Inter-Dec so it helped knowing the regulations and rules previously. This assignment required me to be effective and creative at the same time and they helped me by giving me corrections and changes to adjust along the way.

The third week consisted of digitizing architectural surveys of several interior spaces. This is where I truly started getting comfortable with this task, knowing full well that this is what I will do in the future. I asked less questions and worked faster at this point. Especially when you're references aren't your own drawings and pictures. On this day, I was able to make a couple adjustments on an original drawing as well as digtize several interior spaces.



Anonymus Concepts employees must provide their own laptop in order to work. My Macbook wasn't able to support many programs therefore, the first 3 weeks I worked mainly on plans and elevations on AutoCad. The last 2 weeks of my internship were mainly focused around 3D visuals, letting me work from elsewhere. As I further my career in this industry, I expect to be more prepared with better equipment of my own that can properly handle the demands required by this type of work.

For my final assignment, I worked on a 3D model of a grocery store which I vastly underestimated how complicated it would be. With school nearing finals, my 3Ds file continuously crashed throughout the process and I quickly started going into panic mode. Here's the lesson I learned: take your time with 3D modeling. I've always had several weeks to complete a project on 3Ds Max for school so although I do not feel satisfied with my end product, I feel as I've learned a valuable lesson, and that to me is more important than having a perfect product every time at this stage of my career. I also did appreciated the fact that they let me work on 3D modeling considering the fact that my laptop couldn't happen such software, and allow me to work on this assignment from outside the office, where 3Ds Max was available to me. One of the strongest points at Anonymus Concepts is their 3D Visuals department which consist of talented 3D Artist, so it was very much a great opportunity to be able to work with them. If I could spend more time interning for them, it would definitely be for elevating my 3D Modeling skills to someday achieve their level.

I've really enjoyed my experience as an intern at Anonymus Concepts and again, truly wished I had more time to fully learn everything they had to offer. I also felt that having school at the same time didn't allow me to really take on the full experience as intended to.
