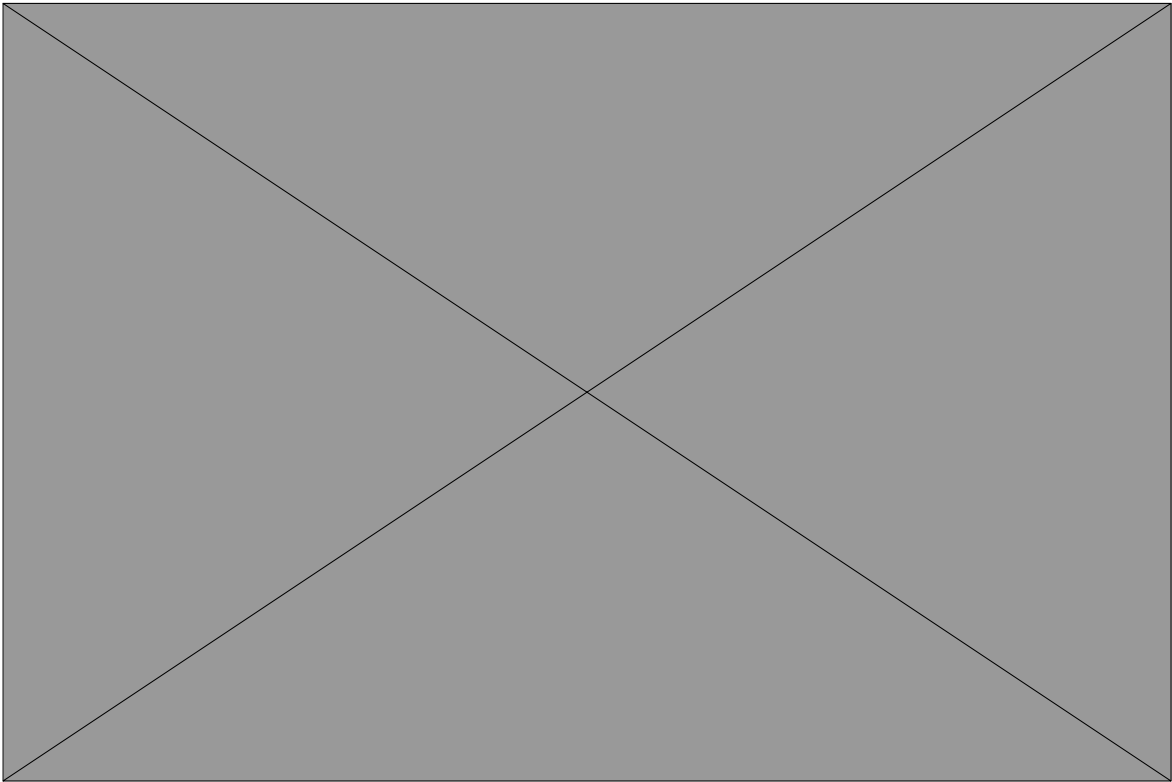

Leather Jacket :

- Nothing works better than a white fitted classic t-shirt underneath a bomber jacket and you're good to go! If you're a fuller guy on the top, try a black style of t-shirt at a longer length. It will make you look slimmer.

TOP COATS & OVERCOATS

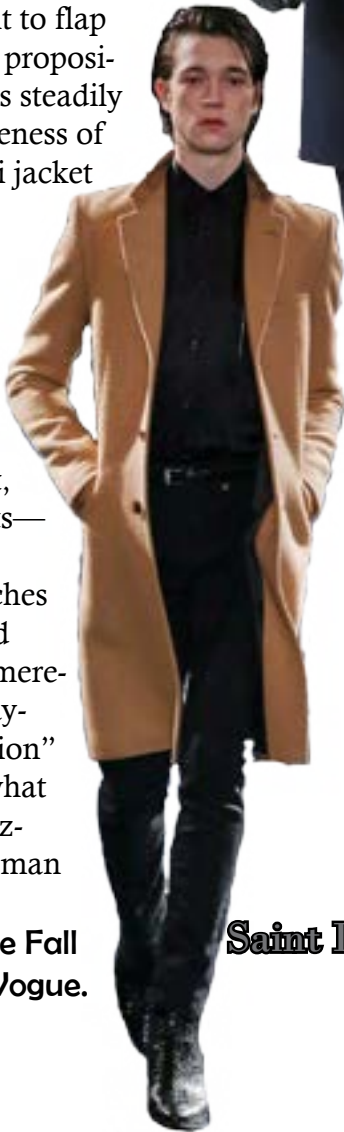
Heading to the office means looking the part. This year's Fall/Winter collections showed many varieties of work-worthy jackets. Here are some of the more subtle/classic options, including pea coats, trench coats, and overcoats. Designers such as Hermès, Topshop, and Lemaire.

Fall 2015's articulation of that Mr. Reliable was based on Alexandre, the amorously entangled protagonist played by Jean-Pierre Léaud in La Maman et la Putain. Sometimes the evocation was uncanny, from the tousled hair and soulful eyes down to the lounge-lizard boots and high-leg trousers. This, though, was not just a finely styled homage to Rive Gauche listlessness and the moment in menswear when '60s spareness morphed into '70s overgenerosity. A two-button double-breasted built to flap forward was a palatable proposition. Outerwear volumes steadily increased, from the closeness of a precise pale-blue safari jacket or a shrunken eight-button caban/peacoat, via a shoulder-robbed herringbone overcoat, to the amped-up lustrous excess of mild-toned cloaks and ponchos. In sync with a higher waist, those boot-flashing pants—which at their scantiest stopped perhaps two inches above the ankle—looked clean and possible, not merely empty retro. Vince Taylor's "Rock 'N Roll Station" played through it all—what an unsettlingly mesmerizing song. Yet Lemaire's man stayed steady.

CITY-OUTERWEAR

PEA COATS / PARKAS

The working man works hard for his dollar and so his clothes need to work hard too. Enter the over coat. The over coat is a traditional piece of outerwear that has a certain designation, without being flashy.

What is more important and distinguished than the business suit? The over coat that holds it all together, as parka or duffel would look clumsy here. The overcoat's purpose is also to provide warmth and protection from nasty weather.

And not just for winter, it's essential fashion property in autumn or spring too, depending on the fabric. A versatile investment, this business-savvy, luxurious piece will look just as good with a sweater and jeans as it will over of a three-piece suit. No-one knows the true origins of the pea coat but the most common tale links to US naval men who favoured the heavy topcoat made from thick, twilled blue cloth. But let's focus on its features.

The pea coat is cut slightly longer than a regular jacket but it remains shorter than a greatcoat to accommodate

movement. Originally designed for 'reefers' – sailors who climbed up the riggings of sailing ships – the classic pea coat is close fitting, has a slightly indented waist, and flairs out slightly around the hips. The coat also boasts broad lapels, is double-breasted, often large wooden, metal or plastic buttons, and slash pockets for easy hand placement.

They are sophisticated for office wear and look super dapper for smart casual weekends – especially in navy, grey and camel.
