The destination we chose for our project is the Kruger National Park which is one of the oldest and largest national parks in Africa. The reason we chose it is because of its history and beauty as well as how it came to be.

I. INTRODUCTION TO KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

Kruger National Park is located in the Northeastern region of South Africa, between the Limpopo and Mpumalanga provinces. It was established as a National Park in 1926 and it is one of the largest game reserves in Africa. It is known for having the famous big five that include lions, leopards, rhinos, elephants and buffalos; other wildlife and various bird species are also found in the reserve. The subtropical climate has allowed the wildlife to thrive in their habitat and made it ideal for a Safari experience to be enjoyed by visitors. Kruger National Park has boosted the tourism industry greatly, the surrounding activities and places to visit contribute to a worthy experience desired by tourists. Where nearly 2 million hectares of unrivaled diversity of life forms fuses with historical and archaeological sights, this is real Africa. The world-renowned Kruger National Park offers a wildlife experience that ranks with the best in Africa.

Normally, the lodges have 4 or 5 night combo packages that include two or three nights at one establishment, and another two or three nights at another. This provides you with the ideal opportunity to enjoy two different luxury locations.

and Facebook ads. We will utilize multi-channel marketing strategies so as to reach families and seniors, be it online or offline. The other places to position our products to our target clientele include exhibition stands, catalogues and television advertisements. The price of our product aims to deliver value to our clients, it sums up the actual selling price factoring in the competitive benchmarks, seasonal discounts, expenditure costs and others. Our main competitors are the big game lodges, resorts, as well as the luxurious safari tours. They have been presented for many years and they aim for a particular niche market, which offer exorbitant prices for brief periods of stay. Most of the activities other than safari guided tours are big game hunting tourists and trekking fanatics. They aim to attract a niche market which focuses mainly on luxury travellers as most prices may exceed at the lowest rate \$5,000.00 per room night. It is our job to make this more accessible for travelers with less buying power.


2. Disadvantages

- Tourism may bring nuisible and irresponsible travelers over a period of time, who will have a negative impact on the environment and the nation's resources,
- Travelers who come from abroad come to South Africa for big game hunting,
- Safari tours always represent a risk as animals can be unpredictable (big game such as lions and hyenas, smaller ones such as the Tsetse fly which causes sleeping sickness and mosquitoes responsible for dengue fever and malaria),

- The economy of South Africa is not at its best, social and cultural differences and inequalities are still very present throughout the country, as well as memorials which relate to the horrors the country once endured during apartheid.

VI. KRUGER'S STATISTICS

1. Climate



Kruger experiences winter and summer at the opposite times as Europe and North America and they correspond to the Dry and Wet season, respectively. The wet summer months (October to April) are hot and often humid. Dry winters (May to September) are warm and mild although it cools off considerably at night. It is advisable to take warm clothing for early morning and evening game drives.

1.1 Dry season (May to September)

There is almost no rainfall during the winter, and the humidity is very low. The Animals are mostly attracted to permanent water sources as water becomes scarce in the bush.


May	Temperatures are cooling down to typically 12°C/54°F in the morning and 27°C/81°F in the afternoon.
June, July and August	When waking up, mornings will be cold so it's recommended to pack warm winter clothing. The average morning temperature is 10°C/50°F. Afternoons will be pleasant with temperatures around 26°C/79°F and cloudless skies.
September	The heat gradually builds up to about 29°C/84°F in the afternoon, and the first rains bring relief from very dry conditions. Mornings are less cold with temperatures around 14°C/57°F.

1.2 Wet Season or Rainy Season (October to April)

It can be uncomfortably hot and humid in the summer. Temperatures usually reach well over 40°C/104°F, although average daytime temperatures reach 32°C/90°F with high humidity. It rarely rains all day, but the pattern is afternoon storms.

Months	Description
October & November	It gets warmer and starts to rain more often, mostly in the afternoon. Temperatures are between 18°C/64°F in the morning and 31°C/88°F in the afternoon.

2. Tourists and Visitors



In the 86 years of the detailed visitor statistics that are available, visitor numbers have shown a big increase. The first 20 years of the total period were mostly declines compared to the previous year's visitor numbers that were recorded. The decrease in numbers often coincided with political unrest or global economic recession. Visitors to the Kruger National Park doubled between 1934 and 1947, between 1947 and 1954, between 1954 and 1963 and again from 1963 to 1973. Visitors increased to 50,000 in 1948 and to 100,000 by 1955.

The park's staff often could not keep track with the increase in visitors and new innovative solutions, such as putting up rows of tents, had to be found in order to keep up with the oncoming visitors. In 1963 a total of 200,000 visitors were recorded and in 1984 visitors totalled 500,000. In 2002 the number of visitors surpassed one million for the first time. Since the first 90 years from when the first visitors entered the park, numbers have grown by 67,323 fold to the latest figure of 1,817,724 for 2016/2017.

VII. KRUGER TRAVEL GUIDE

1. Where to go in Kruger National Park

Kruger National Park has multiple activities around the park to attract guests. The most popular ones include mountain bike trails, guided bush walks, bird watching, golf, self-drives, night drives through the National Park, wellness spa treatments, hot air balloon flights, caving near the Kruger National Park, 4WD trails and wilderness trails.

Besides, Kruger National Park has a multiple selection of options for safari tours to accommodate every guest, which you can later create a plan with all the activities you would like to do during your stay at the Kruger National Park.

- When going on safaris in the Kruger National Park you have the chance to see and watch the "big 5" which are buffalos, elephants, leopards, lions and rhinos in their natural habitat,
- Experience South African cuisine,
- Biltong lekker (South African beef jerky),
- Souvenir shops for items which are made with raw materials that have been sourced locally.

 The items may include sculptures, handcrafted items such as necklaces and bracelets.

2. Where to stay in Kruger National Park

All around Kruger National Park, there are different types of accommodations from rest camps to luxury lodges. Particularly, six different luxury lodges are established within the Park.

2.1 Luxury Lodges

Jock Safari Lodges

Which are two different types of rooms. The main Jock lodge which has twelve and can accommodate two adults per room. Each of these rooms has air conditioning, a private pool and deck, a minibar, a telephone, a safe, an ensuite bathroom, an outdoor shower and an outdoor daybed to watch the scenery surrounding you. The main Jock lounge also has a gym, gift shop, spa, fireplace, Wi-Fi and you can experience a nature walk around the estate. The Fitzpatrick at Jock, is one lodge with three rooms which includes king beds and twin beds depending on the room. With the lodge comes en suite bathrooms and outside shower, safe, minibar, ceiling fan, telephone, swimming pool, fireplace and Wi-Fi. Also like the main Jock lodge you can take nature walks around. At the Jock Safari lodge, you can prepare your stay and plan activities they offer like game drives, wilderness walks, leopard creek golf club which has thirteen holes, birdwatching, Pilgrims rest retreat spa and Kid on safari.

Lukimbi Safari Lodge

This lodge offers two different types of suites, the premier suites which includes a dining area, a lounge, an ensuite bathroom, an inside and outside shower, a second bathroom, a private pool and separate bedrooms. They also offer the classic suites which includes a private deck and lounge, ensuite bathroom, inside and outside shower, air conditioning, safe, mosquito net, coffee amenities and minibar.

While staying at Lukimbi safari lodge, you can explore the park with guided bush walks, birdwatching over 420 species. They also offer accommodation for special events, four conference centers which can hold forty guests with a fully equipped conference pack and audiovisual equipment. Also they can hold weddings which can accommodate up to thirty two people. You can hold your wedding in their own private chapel and the lodge takes care of the theming, flowers, wedding cake, music, legal proceedings and cuisine. The lodge also has different facilities such as a curio shop, a fine dining room, golf which is held at the Leopard Creek, a spa, a pool, a gym and children's program.

Rhino Post Safari Lodge

The accommodation includes a double vanity, an outdoor shower, minibar, mosquito net, safe, laundry service, electric blanket, hairdryer, telephone. During your stay, there are multiple facilities at your disposition such as a swimming pool, communal lounge, dining area, outside fireplace and active waterhole. Also, you can plan activities during your stay such as a safari drive, sleep out under the stars, golf at Skukuza, a tailor made birding safari and In room massage.

Hoyo Hoyo Safari Lodge

They have six accommodations with eathly colored walls and thatched roofs to fully experience the wilderness with air conditioning in all six lodges. The lodges bring local culture to the guests. Each lodge has a safe, a large stone bath, an outdoor shower, bathroom amenities, umbrellas and insect repellent. Hoyo Hoyo safari lodge does not have Wi-Fi or telephone services, but they have facilities such as a pool and a spa. During their stay, the guest can experience safaris such as 4x4 trails, bird watching, self-driving and guided walks. Traditional Braai, which is a barbecue. They serve English breakfast in the morning, offer a buffet service during lunch time, and a three course meal for dinner.

Hamiltons Tented Camp

The camp has six tents to offer guests all with an ensuite bathroom, outside shower, private veranda, air conditioning and mosquito net. They have facilities such as a butler service, swimming pool

and spa. You can also experience different types of safaris such as 4x4 trails, bird watching, self driving and guided walks. You can also dine at the restaurant which is inspired by the 1900s during your stay.

Singita Lebombo Lodge

They have three different accommodations, thirteen rooms with one bed suite and magnificent view, two rooms with two bed suites with a plunge pool and a view of the river. One villa with four bedrooms, a swimming pool, lounge, dining room and deck. They also offer different facilities such as a swimming pool, a spa center, a gym, the Singita boutique and gallery, a television and Wi-Fi. While staying you can plan your day with different activities such as game drives, guided safari walks, wine tasting, stargazing and cooking classes about traditional food.

2.2 Rest Camps

Berg-en-Dal Rest Camp

The rest camp has sixty-nine bungalows with kitchenettes, bathrooms and showers with two to three single beds and air conditioning. Twenty-three family cottages with fully equipped kitchens, two types of bedrooms, one with a double bed and the other with two single beds, an en suite bathroom and two bench beds in the lounge. Two guest houses which one of them can accommodate six people and the other eight people. Seventy-two campsites with a communal kitchen and washing facilities. The rest camp as different facilities such as a swimming pool, convenience shop on site, restaurant A-la-carte and take-out. And to experience the park even more there are different activities offered, such as self drive game viewing, sunrise and sunset drive, morning and afternoon bush walks, bush braais, brush breakfast, 4x4 trails, golf courses in Leopard Creek, Malelane and Skukuza, and non guided rhino trails in camp. While staying you might encounter wild dogs, klipspringers, leopards, scarlet-chested sunbirds and heuglin's robins.

Crocodile Bridge Camp

The camp has twenty bungalows which there are two available for physically disabled guests with an ensuite bathroom and air conditioning. Eighteen camping sites with communal kitchens and washing facilities and eight safari tents with a bathroom and communal kitchen. You can also do activities such as bird watching, guided walks and driving tours to see animals like a kudu, giraffes, cheetahs, white rhinos and spotted hyenas.

Mopani Rest Camp

The rest camp has forty-five bungalows with four beds, kitchenettes, bathrooms and verandas. Twelve cottages with kitchenettes, four beds, two bathrooms and verandas. Forty-five guest cottages with three bedrooms including six beds, bathroom, kitchen, lounge, dining area and a large veranda. Finally one guest house - Xanatseni with eight beds, a large lounge, a dining room and kitchen, outside bar and veranda. You can also experience the facilities and activities of the rest camp such as the swimming pool, convenience shop, ATM and a restaurant A-la-carte, bush braai, guided walks and morning and night drives.

Skukuza Rest Camp

The rest camp has eighty camping sites with communal kitchens and bathrooms. One hundred seventy eight economy bungalows with varying facilities. Twenty bungalows with en suite bathrooms and kitchenettes. One family cottage with four bedrooms, equipped kitchen, a living room, a bathroom and a river view. Twenty safari tents with kitchenettes, communal kitchens and bathrooms. Four guesthouses that offer accommodations and lodging for larger groups. Finally, one dormitory which holds thirty two places for girls and thirty two places for boys. While staying at the rest camp you can experience their facilities and activities such as a nine hole golf course, two a-la-carte restaurants, curio and convenience shop, ATM, guided walks, morning and night drives, museums, wildlife videos, swimming pool, kids education programs and bush braai.

2.3 Conference Facilities

Some luxury lodges in the Kruger National Park as small conference and wedding facilities. But the biggest facilities are in the rest camp such as:

Berg-en-Dal Rest Camp

This conference facility has one hall and can be transformed into three different rooms, it also has standard offerings such as a flip chart, white board, white projection screens, notepads, point pen, bottled water, sweets / mints, data projector, laser pointer, lectern, TV and DVD. They also have optional equipment which may include an additional cost such as a technician on duty, photocopier and copies, faxing services and telephone facilities. The hall sitting arrangements can be in three different ways. A schoolroom which can hold 144 delegates, theatre / cinema room that can hold 324 delegates and a banquet room which can have 120 delegates. One is also U-shaped which can hold 21 delegates, a schoolroom which can hold 36 delegates and theatre / cinema room which can have 72 delegates. Finally room two and three can have the same sitting arrangements same as room one but the U-shaped can have 32 delegates, the schoolroom can accommodate 48 delegates and theatre / cinema 108 delegates. The venue can also be used for weddings

Mopani Rest Camp

This facility can hold not only conferences but also weddings. For the wedding venue the ceremony can be held in five different places such as Mooiplaas, bush braai site, walkway, fish eagle terrace and the conference centre desk. Then the reception can also be held at five different places like bush braai site, walkway, restaurant, boma, conference centre. Then for the conference center the standard offerings include flip charts, white boards, a white projection screen, notepads, point pen, bottled water, sweets/mint, data projector, laser pointer, lectern, TV and DVD and PA system with lapel or

handheld microphones. There is also optional equipment such as photocopiers, copies and faxing services.

There are six different venues for conferences, such as Xanasti which can be U-shaped for 50 delegates, Schoolroom for 120 delegates, theatre / cinema for 300 delegates and banquet for 120 delegates. Matomani 1, 2 & 3 (combined) as a U-shaped for 40 delegates, schoolroom for 54 delegates, theatre / cinema for 150 delegates. Matomani 1 & 2 (combined) in a U-shaped for 30 delegates, schoolroom for 30 delegates and theatre / cinema for 65 delegates. Matomani 1 which can be arranged in a U-shaped for 12 delegates, schoolroom for 12 delegates and theatre / cinema for 25 delegates. Matomani 2 which can be in U-shape for 10 delegates, schoolroom for 16 delegates and theatre / cinema for 30 delegates. Finally, Matomani 3 in a U-shaped for 16 delegates, schoolroom for 16 delegates and finally theatre / cinema for 45 delegates.

Skukuza Rest Camp

The venue can be used as a conference center and wedding venue. Weddings can be held at the conference venues and Skukuza golf club. For the conference center they have standard offerings such as flip charts, white boards, white projection screens, notepads, point pen bottled water, sweets / mints, data projector, laser pointer, lectern, TV and DVD, a PA system with lapel or handheld microphones. The optional equipment which may be an additional cost are photocopiers, copies, faxing services, translation booth service and internet services. There are six different venues, first Skukuza conference centre which can be arranged as a U-shape for 250 delegates, schoolroom for 500 delegates, theatre / cinema for 800 delegates and banquet for 500 delegates. Then, breakaway, breakaway 1,2 and 3 have the same capacity of delegate for each room, which can be in a U-shape for 50 delegates, schoolroom for 30 delegates, theatre / cinema for 80 delegates. Finally, Skukuza auditorium which can only be arranged as a theatre / cinema sitting arrangement for 180 delegates.

3. Kruger tours and activities
