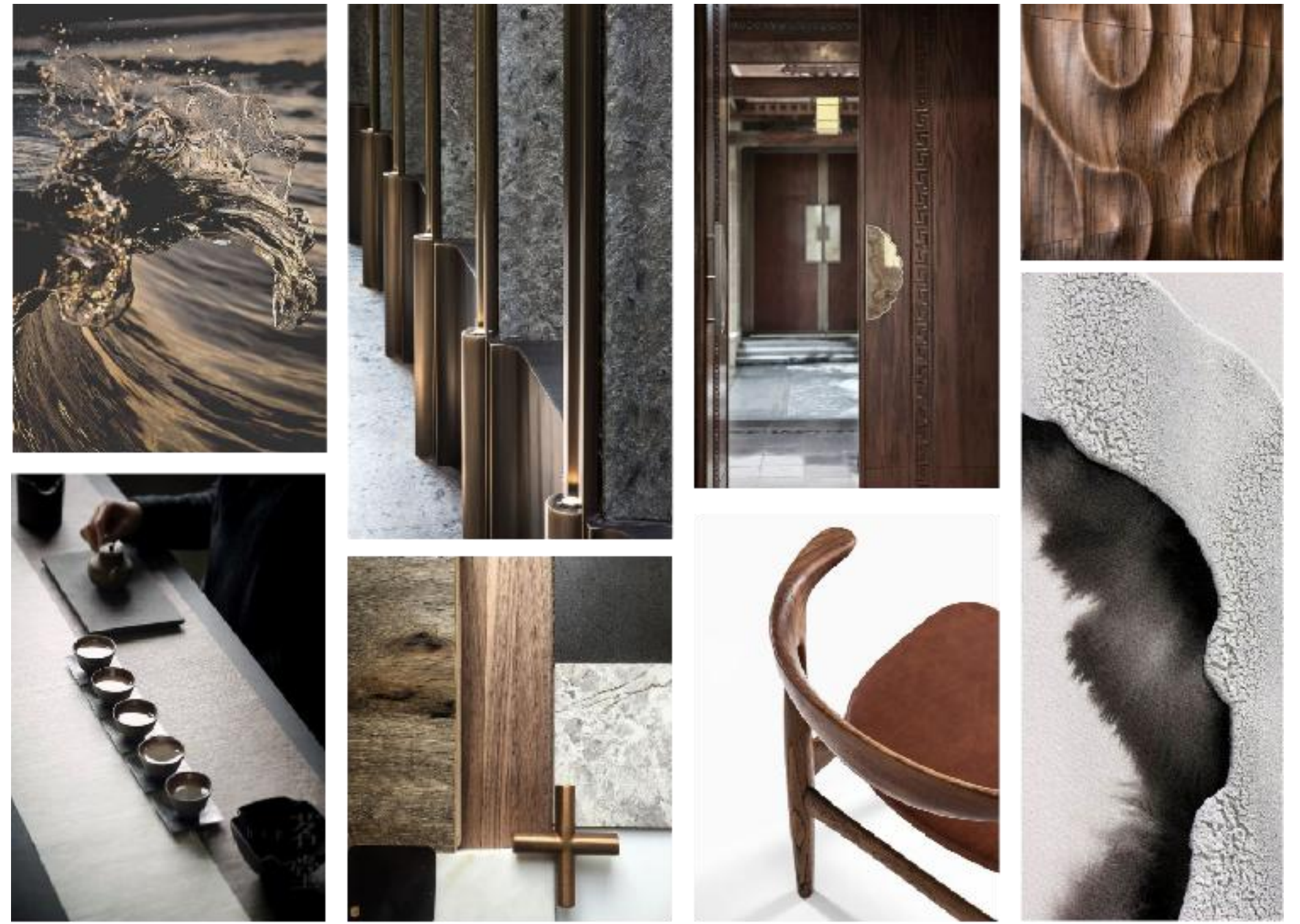

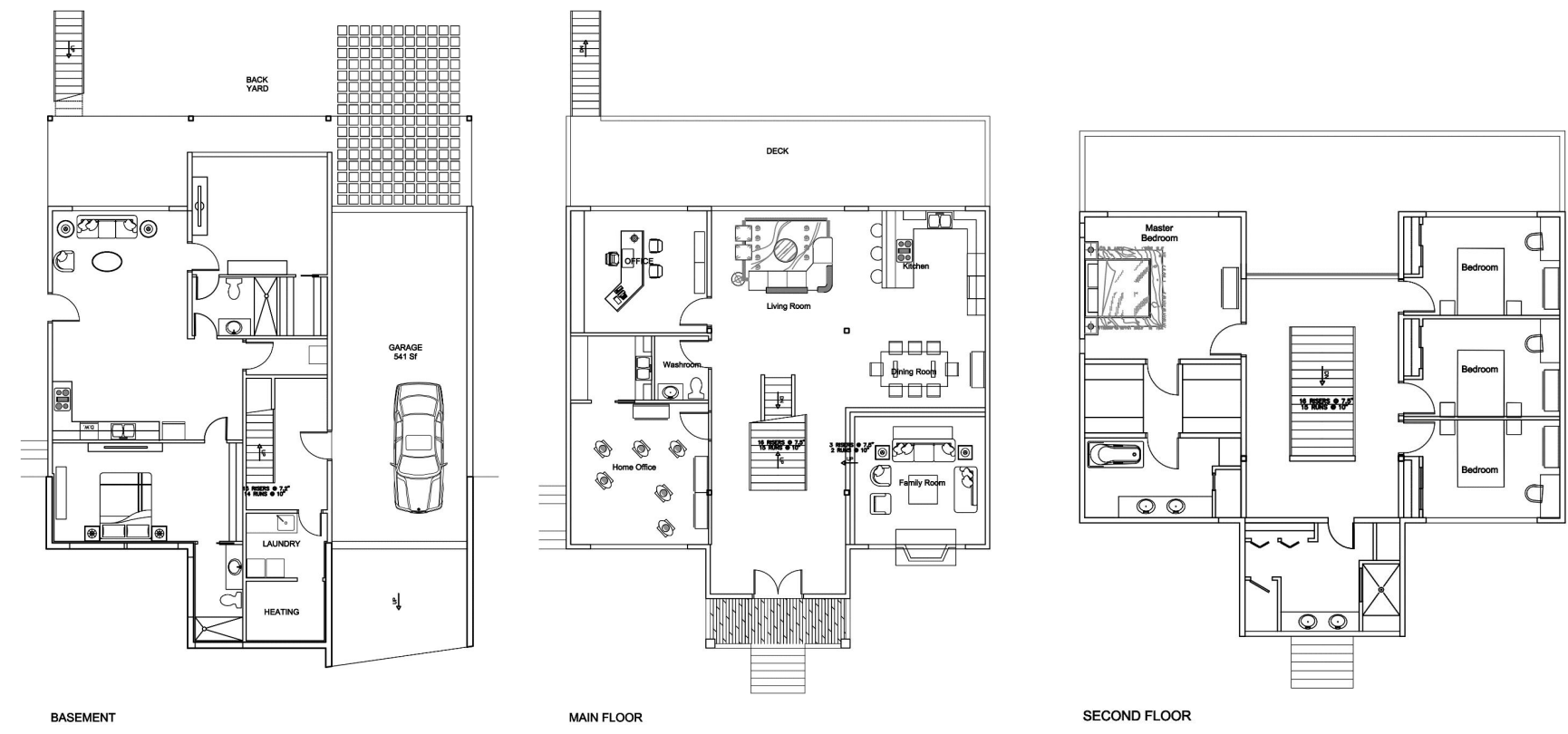
## Concept Statement

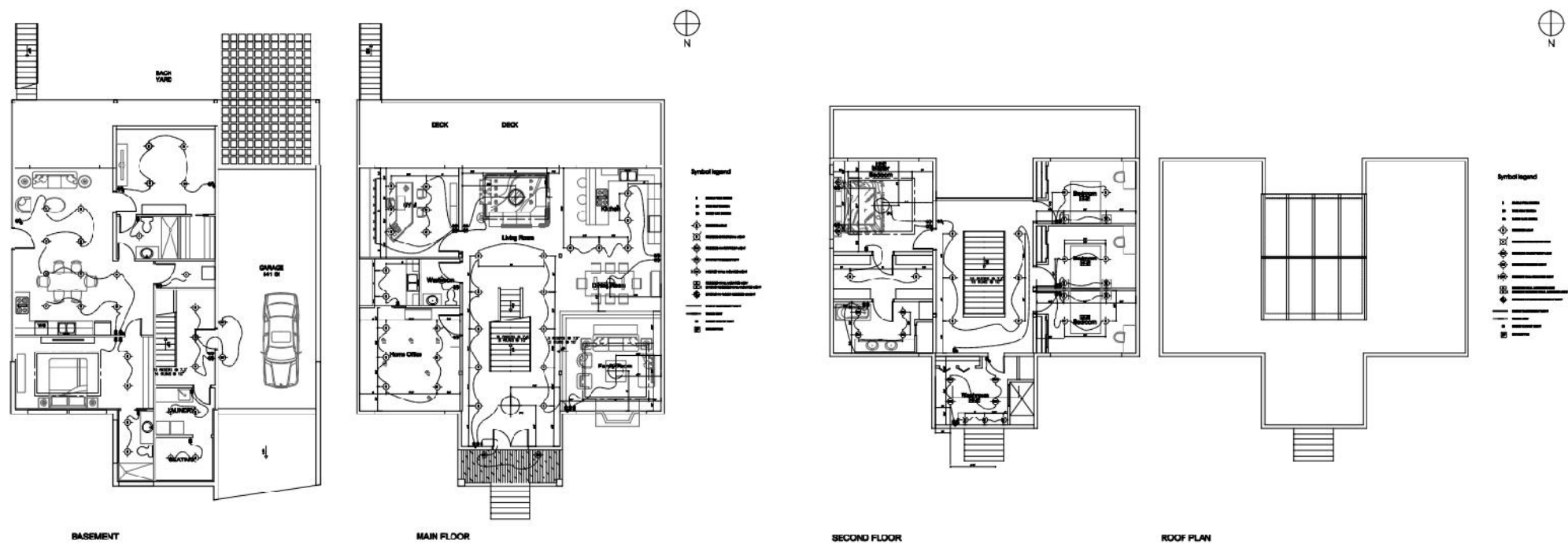
## Floor Plan



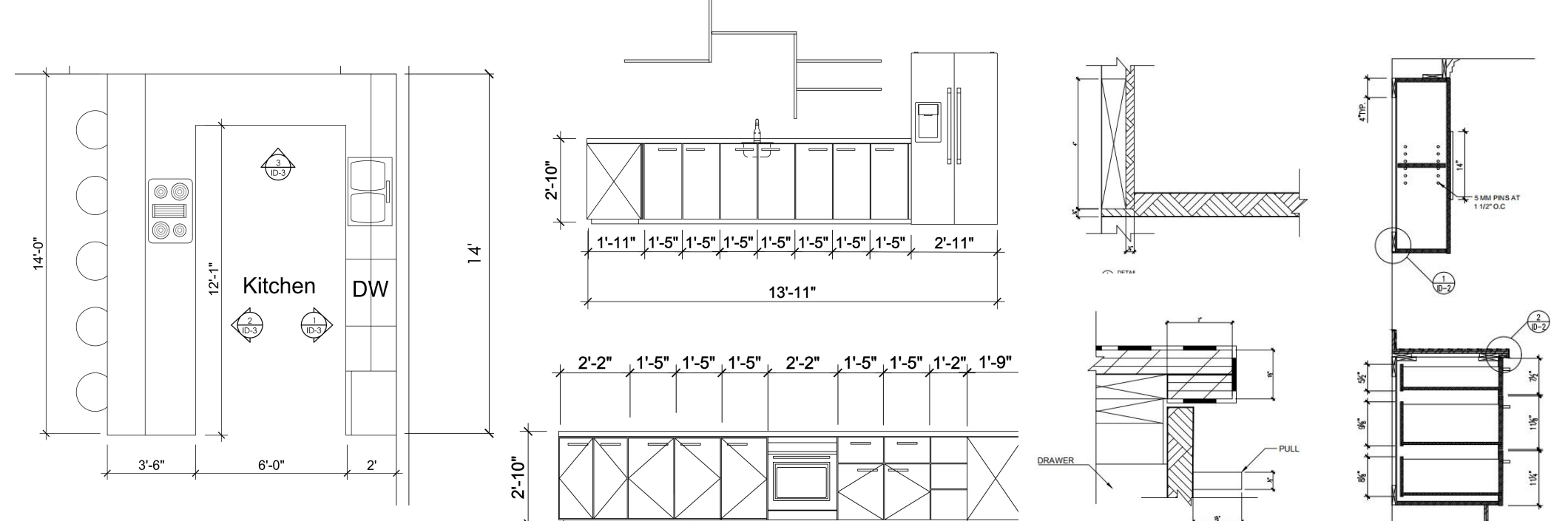
## Diagram Plan



## Reflected Ceiling Plan



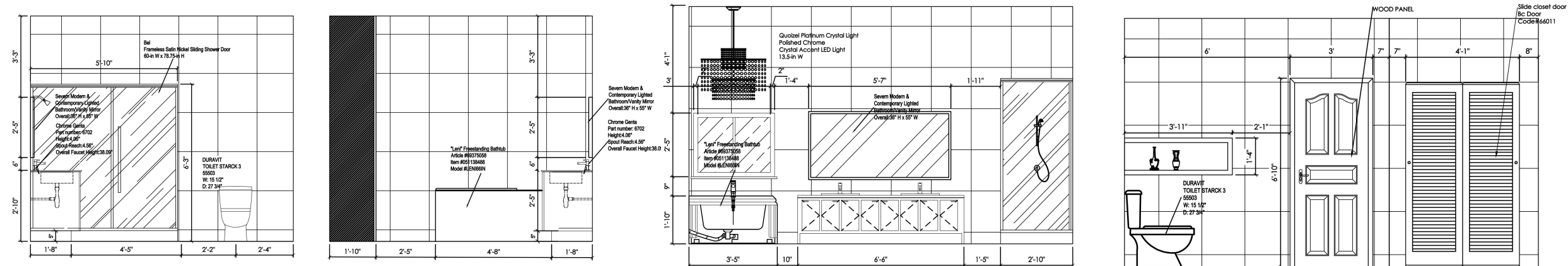

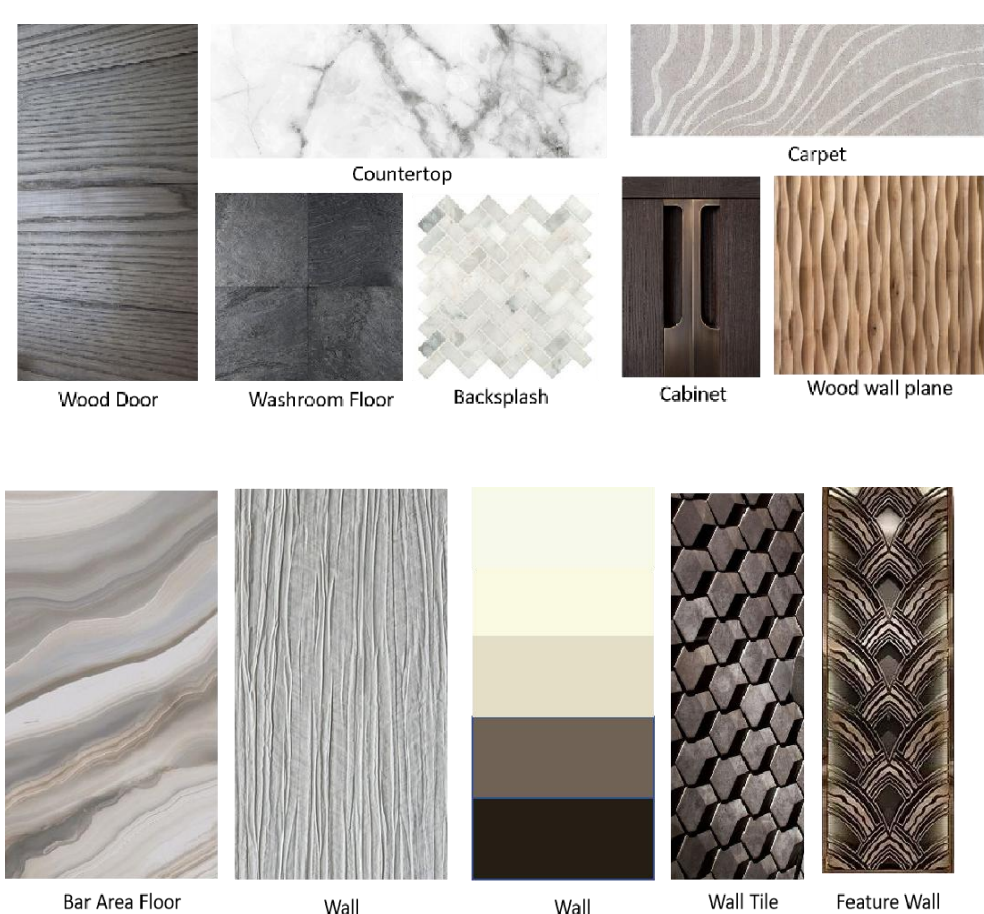

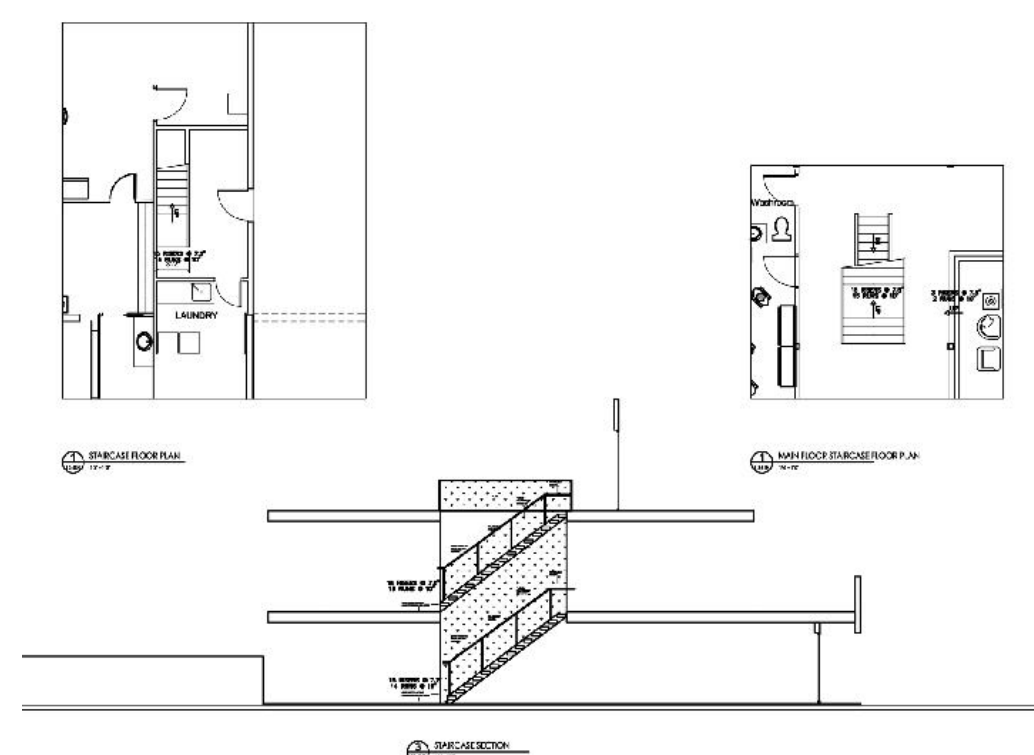
